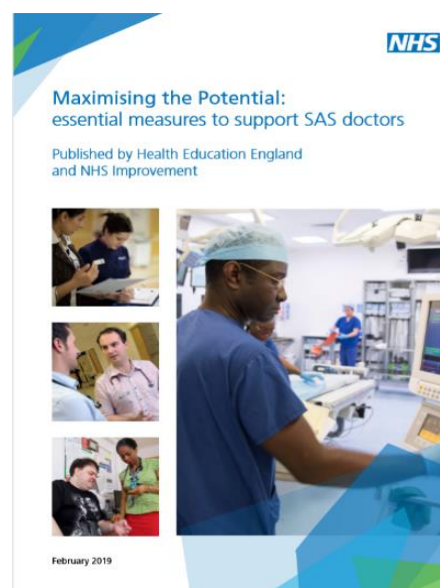
Improved support for SAS Doctors

Specialty and Associate Specialist (SAS) doctors in England will have access to improved support and better development opportunities thanks to measures outlined in the report [Maximising the potential: essential measures to support SAS doctors](#).

SAS doctors make up 20% of the medical workforce but many say they lack workplace support, find it hard to move between specialties, have limited access to training and some have reported bullying.

Through implementation of the shared commitments in the report, HEE along with NHS Improvement and other partners will work together to improve opportunities for SAS doctors to advance as clinicians and leaders in healthcare, to improve the knowledge of what they do among other healthcare professionals and to promote SAS as an attractive career option.

CESR Support WhatsApp Group

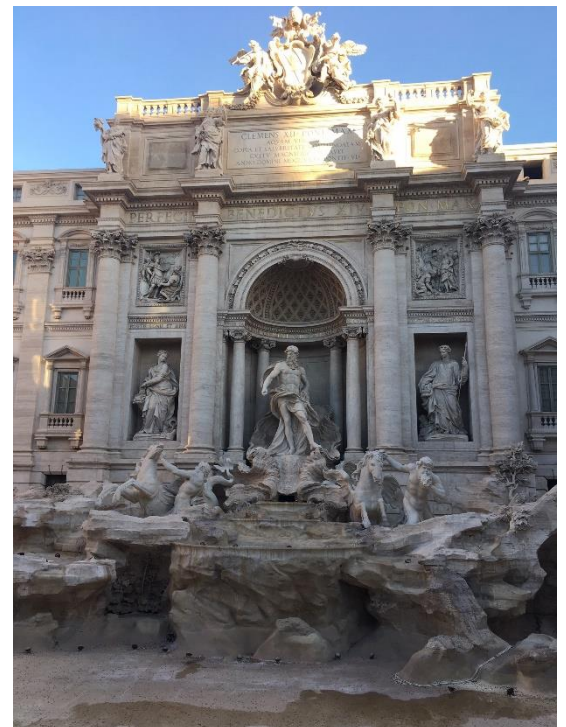

How I used the SAS Development Fund

Dr Gordon Bottomley, Associate Specialist in Community Paediatrics (Wrightington, Wigan & Leigh NHS Foundation Trust) used the SAS Development Fund to help him attend the International Children's Continence Society (ICCS) Congress in Rome in September 2018. Dr Bottomley shares some of his reflections from the meeting:

"I am a Paediatrician in Wigan and I have long specialised in treating children's continence problems. This is a very important area of work, as the conditions mentioned affect possibly 5% of young people of all ages to a distressing degree at any one time. I am a longstanding member of the ICCS. This is the foremost organisation promoting research and good practice in my specialist area. The ICCS has been in existence for 25 years and has produced many important standardisation and best practice documents in areas not covered by NICE guidelines.

Each year the ICCS holds a congress, bringing together practitioners from different specialties (e.g. Urology, Paediatrics, Nephrology, Nursing, Physiotherapy, Psychiatry) from around the world to share best practice and new research. Over 4 days, there is a good mix of workshops, courses, keynote lectures and abstracts. It is also an excellent way to network with like-minded colleagues and get new ideas and inspiration. The grant provided by the HEE helped me with some of the costs of attending this year's Congress in Rome. The Congress fully lived up to my expectations, following attendance at previous Congresses over the past 10 years in Boston and London. There was much helpful information and interaction, which consolidated my current practice and provided ideas for treatment of intractable problems. I am very grateful to have attended and thank your organisation for providing the grant. There are very few advanced courses and meetings for doctors in this field in the UK."
