	stations, clinics and other associated sites. Travel costs from base location to	
	other sites will only be reimbursed for business mileage (valid insured	
	drivers/vehicles) and journeys using all forms of public transport (including taxis)	
	will be reimbursed at the public transport rate.

	& RCPsych. The programme is designed to equip the trainee for Higher Specialist
