

CT1 Psychiatry: South West, Severn

<p>Programme Details</p>	<p>*The South West Deanery is split into Severn and Peninsula, please see pages 3 & 4 of this document for Peninsula programme details*</p> <p>During the first two years of training, there is an emphasis on general adult and old age psychiatry including a broad range of community based psychiatry and developmental psychiatry.</p> <p>The CT3 year is focused around specialist psychiatric training. During their final Core Training year, trainees are also expected to spend one session per week in a 'special interest' session, in order to broaden their experience of the specialties.</p> <p>All Trainees receive one hour of protected supervision with their Educational Supervisor and all Trainees' timetables are designed to allow them guaranteed access to the Severn Core Psychiatry Training Course. <p>Expected Rotation Information</p>	<p>All CT1 posts available in Severn for the February 2018 intake are to commence at 2gether NHS Foundation Trust</p> <p>For the first two years, trainees are placed in a 'sub rotation' in a defined geographical area, with a Tutor allocated to each area. During these first two years, there is an emphasis on general adult and old age psychiatry including a broad range of community based psychiatry and developmental psychiatry. Each post lasts for six months.</p> <p>The CT3 year is focused around specialist psychiatric training, including experience in Forensic Psychiatry, Learning Disability Psychiatry, Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, Addiction Psychiatry, Psychotherapy, Liaison Psychiatry, Rehabilitation Psychiatry and Neuropsychiatry. During their final Core Training year, trainees are also expected to spend one session per week in a 'special interest' session, in order to broaden their experience of the specialities.</p> <p>2gether NHS Foundation Trust is a specialist trust providing social and mental healthcare services in Gloucestershire and Herefordshire. Including providing assessment, signposting & wellbeing support, as well as the provision of learning disability services in Gloucestershire. We support around 19,000 individuals at any one time and offer education and support to their carers. 96% of our services are provided within the community and as close to an individuals' family and friends as possible. This is an essential factor in helping to improve a person's recovery.</p> <p>Where You'll Work: As a junior doctor you will have the opportunity to work with individuals in community and inpatient settings. We have three inpatient units in Gloucestershire covering working and old age individuals; Wotton Lawn Hospital, Charlton Lane Hospital and Greyfriars Psychiatric Intensive Care Unit. There is also a low secure forensic unit, Montpellier, in Gloucester. In the community there are numerous teams including recovery, crisis resolution and home treatment, early intervention in psychosis, assertive outreach and eating disorders. Let's Talk offers group and one to one psychological therapy to which individuals can refer themselves.</p> <p>We hold quarterly Junior Doctor Forums which are chaired by the Medical Director in Gloucestershire and in Herefordshire by the Director of Medical Education. We have been the highest ranking Mental Health Trust in the Severn School of Psychiatry as per the GMC National Trainees Survey in 2015 and 2016.</p>
