Programme Information	Child & Adolescent Psychiatry	
	This scheme offers excellent higher training in child and adolescent psychiatry at ST4-6 level. There are 10 posts in the scheme ranging from general community, CAMHS, to specialtist posts in Eating Disorders, ASD assessment learning disabilities and Tier 4 (in-patient) services. Special interest sessions are available and trainees are encouraged to gain advanced training in psychological therapies. There is a strong emphasis on research and teaching with two professors actively involved in the scheme. There are regular group research supervision meetings and a weekly academic programme.	
	General Adult Psychiatry There are 29 trainees on the scheme and opportunities for a wide range of clinical experience, together with access to resources to develop teaching, research, audit, management and leadership. The scheme offers trainees a three year programme with clinical posts to cover the clinical aspects of the curriculum. These placements are in a variety of settings, in teaching centres and district general hospitals, covering both urban and rural populations in three Trusts across the Mersey Region. The GA training scheme is part of the School of Psychiatry of Mersey Deanery. The head of School is Dr Manoj Agarwal and the Training Programme Director is Dr Kauser Tabani Training placements are allocated by the training programme director according to training needs, and posts rotate each year in August and in some cases, in February. Trainees' preference is given consideration as part of the post allocation process. The clinical experience is complemented by opportunities in other aspects of training provided locally within training placements and centrally by the School of Psychiatry and the Deanery.	
	The trainee will be expected to work in different clinical placements to achieve experience with in-patients and patients within community and in out-patient clinics. In addition to generic in patient and community services, trainees have opportunities to gain an endorsement in rehabilitation, liaison or substance misuse, with several posts available in these sub specialties. There is on call work for all posts sufficient for trainees to attain the recommendation the RCPsych guidance for minimum number of on call duties. In addition to the clinical experience in their main placement, each trainee can undertake Special Interest sessions for one or two half days per week in order to gain a wider variety of experience or pursue particular individual interests. There is a wide range of choice of such placements, including services such as ADHD clinics, neuropsychiatry and psychotherapy. Trainees are able to apply for appropriate local and national courses and conferences which can be funded from the annual study leave budget with approval from Supervising Consultant and the trust Director of Medical Education.

Trainees will gain experience in all aspects of old age psychiatry, and goodlinks with local acute trusts mean that various special interest sessions are also availablee.g. neuroradiology, acute medicine and palliative care. The scheme supports trainees to	

undertake research and higher degrees and there are many teaching opportunities also
available. There is also the opportunity to spend one year of the rotation in an Old Age
Mental Health Liaison Team in an acute hospital.
Psychiatry of Learning Disability
This scheme offers excellent higher training in the psychiatry of learning disabilities at
ST4-6 level. There are currently 3 posts in the scheme; these enable the trainee to gain
experience in general community and inpatient LD psychiatry and also specialised
Forensic LD community and inpatient psychiatry (within a specialised LD low secure
setting). In addition, with agreement from the TPDs for other relevant psychiatric
specialties, it is possible to arrange for the trainee to spend 6 months gaining experience
in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, Forensic Psychiatry or General Adult Psychiatry.
Special interest sessions are available to help meet the trainee's wider training needs and
there is a strong emphasis on research and teaching. There is a weekly LD academic
programme, which all doctors should attend and contribute towards.
