### Your News and Views

#### SAS Doctors as Educators – Dr Kathryn Ashton

This month we heard from Dr Kathryn Ashton from Wrightington, Wigan and Leigh NHS Foundation Trust, who graduated from the University of Manchester as a Medical Educator in December 2018. Dr Ashton has achieved this whilst still working in her role as a Specialty Doctor in Dermatology. She has since taken on the role of teaching FY1 and CMT doctors and is also a tutor at Manchester University for 4th Year Medical Students. Dr Ashton has received outstanding feedback for the excellent 'Dermatology - How to Describe a Lesion' session and has been asked to teach more sessions. She has been commended for her skill, enthusiasm and dedication to teaching. Well done!

#### How I Used the SAS Development Fund

Dr Korah Oommen, Associate Specialist in Cardiothoracic Surgery (Manchester University NHS Foundation Trust) used the SAS Development Fund to help him attend the 26th ESTS Meeting in Slovenia in May 2018. Dr Oomen shares some of his reflections from the meeting:

"I was very impressed by the number of delegates from China, Japan and India and the quality of their presentations and the quality and quantity of thoracic surgery being undertaken in these countries, and their use of Minimally invasive techniques including Robotics. They seem to have an almost unbelievable access to new technology. Some of my colleagues in India were doing up to 20 Robot assisted MITS (Minimally Invasive Thoracic Surgery) a month. I am hoping to attend the 65th Annual Conference of the Indian Association of Cardiovascular and Thoracic surgeons in Chennai India between the 21st and 24th of February 2019.

I was able to try my hand at some new technology in the Industry Exhibition. I was particularly taken by Electromagnetic Navigation bronchoscopy, which allows localisation and marking even of small tumours deep within the lung, to facilitate and target surgical resection

I attended several sessions on Oncology for Surgeons – the number of new trials in this area impressed me. The shifting paradigm in the management of not only late stage lung cancer but also early stage disease lung cancer, with the advent of new immunotherapy agents targeting checkpoint inhibitors like PD1 and PDL-1 and Oncogene driver characterisation of tumours and genomic targeted therapeutic agents, in combination with Chemotherapy and Radiotherapy, both in the Neo-adjuvant and adjuvant setting, with impressive results in disease free survival. This has stimulated my interest in this topic and I hope to learn more about this complex topic of Genomics and Immunotherapy, by trying to access relevant textbooks and articles over the next year.


I also attended seminars on Enhanced recovery in thoracic surgery and on the use of ECMO in thoracic surgery. This is relevant as we have implemented Enhanced recovery techniques, at least partially at Wythenshawe and we need to take on board the protocol more completely to facilitate early and morbidity free recovery for our patients. Interestingly we had recently used V-V ECMO to facilitate repair of tracheal injury in two of our patients with excellent results. As Wythenshawe is the regional Respiratory ECMO and Transplant centre, and we often use ECMO during Lung transplantation, we are very comfortable with the technique.

Overall this was an excellent meeting, well organised, with an excellent venue, impressive International faculty with delegates from across the world with many opportunities to learn and network. I was so impressed that I hope to attend the 27th meeting in Dublin on the 9 June 2019."
